Good news for Hersham shoppers!

- New LidI to open in 2018
- Cashpoint success at last

ersham Conservatives Mary Sheldon, Ruth Mitchell and John O'Reilly recently met with representatives of Lidl UK to discuss the supermarket chain's plans to open store on the former Riverdene Estate in Molesey Road.

Demolition work has been in progress for some weeks and is nearing completion and construction work of the new supermarket and associated flats is due to begin in October.

The development should be complete in March 2018 and the store will create up to 40 jobs.

Lidl UK's Regional Head of Property, Chris Young-Wootton, told us: "There's been much anticipation for this new Lidl store and it's great that we are now in a position to break the ground and start the site redevelopment.

"We are extremely grateful for all the support that we have received so far, and would like to thank everyone

Mary, Ruth and John are enthusiastic about the project and believe Lidl will be a boost for Hersham. We join residents in looking forward to the store's opening.

■ There was more positive news for Hersham Village when, after years of waiting and following a tireless campaign by Ruth Mitchell on behalf of local residents, we learned that Waitrose has agreed to provide a free ATM at their Hersham store.

At the time of writing, all that remains is the installation of the electrics so it is very possible that by the time you read this edition, the cash machine will be up and running!

Speaking to the Hersham News, Ruth commented "For far too long, Hersham and its residents have been disadvantaged compared to other areas of Elmbridge with no free ATM, so I am absolutely thrilled that Waitrose have so generously agreed to locate one here in Hersham.

"This will benefit many local people and already the response on social media has been resoundingly positive. It also shows what a great community spirit we have in Hersham that has made the campaign such a success."

■ INFLATION is running at a mere 0.6% but on 12 October the RA led Elmbridge Cabinet which includes the HVS, voted to increase charges for meals-on-wheels and lunches at the Day Centres, including Hersham, by over nine times that figure.

And it's even worse for community transport users. A single journey to a Day Centre will cost a whopping 30% more from January, and the average rise for transport is over 13%.

Another service charge was also hiked by 14%. They didn't mention this in their election literature, did they!

Bus service cuts

WE were alarmed and dismayed when Abellio Buses notified Surrey County Council (SCC) that bus routes 458, 514 and 555 would be terminated by them.

One glimmer of good news is that the 564 service commencing at Whiteley Village will remain.

Immediately SCC has been seeking a replacement bus operator for those routes and the hope is that very soon another operator will take up running these routes.

If this is successful, we should again revisit whether the 555 can start and finish its route at Whiteley Village as requested by many of its residents. As soon as we have more infor-

mation, we will let you know.

FOLLOWING the groundbreaking event in March when we were honoured to be involved with digging the first and second sods, work has now commenced on the construction of the new Rydens **Enterprise School.**

The contractors are on site and

have started laying roadways and stripping topsoil to prepare for the foundations.

Progress is on schedule and the tower cranes have begun the process of erecting the steel structure.

More improvements in Hersham

OCTOBER is 'Walk to School' Month and what better news that we have used funding from our local CIL Community **Infrastructure Levy (CIL)** to improve the footpaths in **Coronation Recreation Ground.**

Thank you everyone who responded to the recent consultation - your support most certainly helped to secure the funds for this new all-weather route around and across the recreation ground.

Cllr Mary Sheldon said: "This is a popular walking and cycling route and will make it more useable year round, not only for schoolchildren but also for many others who want to walk round the park".

CIL funding of £17,300 was also recently agreed for improvements to the Burwood Playgroup in its new home at St Peter's Institute in Faulkner's Road.

However, an excellent proposal for a short footpath on Hersham Green to link up with the existing one from the children's play area which was backed by most of the councillors representing Hersham has been blocked by the disgraceful action of Cllr Roy Green in persuading the eight non Hersham councillors in the cabinet not to approve it.

I'm delighted at this month's opening of the Burwood preschool in Faulkner's Road and I have given them support through my member's allocation, along with the Hersham Youth Trust, Whiteley Village and the bursary for Looked After Children.

A lot is happening on the road front in Hersham. The long awaited improvements to the entrance of Pleasant Place have now been approved and work is scheduled for February.

The speed table at the Burwood Road/Queen's Road junction will be installed shortly and a large section of Burwood Road pavement has been resurfaced. Surrey County Council is consulting on partial street lighting during the night hours. Please do respond and make your views known.

Hersham Library is dear to us all and I am working to see if we can have an extension on the site that could offer a quiet space, coffee facilities and meeting area.

Pothole frustration

ANY residents have expressed frustration about the state of our roads, potholes, parking, and other highways matters.

Margaret Hicks, Hersham's County Councillor, Mary, Ruth and John all share these concerns and working together do our very best to address them.

On the positive side, Rydens Grove, Green Lane, Mole Road and Primrose Road, Molesey Close, Ashton Close and Eastwick Road have all recently been completely resurfaced, with improvements in Burwood Road too.

Margaret has ensured that Old Esher Road (including the entrance to Old Esher Close) will be resurfaced later this year.

Other good news is that a new road layout will be introduced this financial year to improve the entrance to Pleasant Place off the Burwood Road to improve safety for pedestrians and motorists.

Surface flooding areas in Hersham have been reduced over the recent years and ditches and gullies are cleared and the £40,000 top-up from the Elmbridge Local Committee to the Borough's highly

successful Street Smart team means that vegetation clearance on the highways can be tackled more effectively.

But the inescapable truth is that money is tight - there is honestly no easy 'fix'. Both SCC and EBC have seen funding from central government drastically reduced for many years and it's only going to get worse.

However, that makes the imperative of a more joined-up approach and focus even more essential and your Hersham Conservative team will be unrelenting in seeking improvements.

■ HERSHAM Village Society councillor Roy Green promised free car parking on Saturdays if his side won the election.

But now they are in office, the **Residents Association-Liberal** Democrat coalition he serves, appears to be back-tracking.

Their transport portfolio holder refused to set a date for the introduction of free parking - or to say how it would be paid for - when questioned by the Conservatives.

Instead the Coalition will consult councillors before deciding whether to honour the pledge.



hersham youth trust

We are proud of the amazing work done by youth workers and volunteers, including some local Conservative councillors, at the Hersham Youth Centre in Arch Road.

It continues to attract a large number of young people each week, currently about 150 to 200

between the ages of 11 and 19. The Centre's music room, pool tables, computers and the outdoor area being its most popular features.

What is particularly encouraging is that the young people see the club as a safe place where they can meet their friends.

It is open every week night and Saturdays from 1pm to 5pm.

Recently a team of volunteers laid a new floor in the original part of the building as part of a programme of upgrades. There are currently some spaces for 11-13 year olds on Monday and Thursday evenings. Also during the summer they enjoyed a successful trip to Brighton.

Recycling charges spark fears

SURREY County Council has introduced charges for disposing of non-household waste at its recycling centres.

Critics fear it could lead to more flytipping, but Elmbridge Conservative leader Tim Oliver said that the charges "reflect the financial and environmental cost of landfill".

Elmbridge's new deputy leader in the Coalition, Lib Dem Andrew Davis, told the local media that the Council should do more to make fly-tippers and litter louts feel more like they "belong" in the community! "We should do more to tackle the deeper issues," he said.

Last year alone, it cost Surrey taxpayers £1 million to clear up after fly-tippers.

Cllr Tim Oliver added: "For Cllr Davis to blame the Council or society is a bit patronising. I don't see why people who don't feel part of their community should display that by not bothering to go to a tip.'

Charges range from £5 for tyres to £50 for a car full of building waste.

Congratulations to Ken Bowman for winning first prize in the Best Community or Communal Garden" category.
